THE ADRESARO.
To publish the year book of the Esperanto Association of North America as a special publication and mail it to each of our 2,500 members would cost at least $\$ 100$. By an arrangement made between the executive committee and the American Esperantist Company, we have been enabled to give this as part of this "Special Adresaro Number" at less than one-half the above expense to the association.

The members are arranged according to the divisions and states as named in the constitution. Under each state or province heading is given, first, the state association, societies, clubs, etc., belonging to the Esperanto Association of North America; second, the individual members of the Association arranged by cities and towns. The number preceding the name of a member is his number in the Association.

## OMISSIONS.

Since in this number is given the full list of members to date, and names of all having obtained either diploma of the Association, the 357 new members for the month of February and those passing the examinations are omitted.

In keeping the records of so large a membership in connection with the many other lines of secretarial work, it is quite probable that several errors and omissions have been made. If those discovering any will report them to the secretary for correction on the records, it will be of great assistance.

## OFFICIAL NOTICE.

When the officers took up the work, after the organization of the Esperanto Association of North America last summer, efforts were naturally directed first to the perfection and building up of an organization which, by a large membership, would have some prestige not only in the Esperanto world but also with those who judge the value of any new movement by the number of its supporters. That the Association, which started active work in September with about 300 members, can now present, as in this issue, a list of seventy-two organizations and 2,500 members who have enrolled and contributed their per capita share to the support of the general association within six months. shows what can be done by united effort.
This is, however, but a small indication of the
strength of the movement throughout North America. There are many societies who have not yet joined the Association, and even among the subscribers of Amerika Esperantisto there are thousands who have not officially become part of the movement. This is evidently because the aims of the E. A. of N. A. are not fully understood, since of course the fee for membership (twenty-five cents) would not deter any interested person from adding to the prestige and treasury of the Association in this manner.
To do the work that should be done during the remaining months of the year, to properly use the key given by the action of the Scientific Congress to open the doors of educational authorities and obtain action from our legislators, to demonstrate to the business interests the advantage for international commerce, will require time and money. The officers of the Association can do much, but not without the co-operation and help of all the members. If each member of the E. A. of N. A., and every Esperantist who is not a member, will feel it his duty to assist, a great part of this work can be accomplished. Sone members have contributed many times their share to the support of the work, and many others could do so, but everyone can at least interest one other person in the work of the E. A. of N. A., thus adding to both the treasury and the roll of members of the Association.

## YOUR OPPORTUNITY TO HELP.

In the non-official part of this number will be found the report of the action taken at the PanAmerican Scientific Congress relative to the international language. The following is a translation of the official letter sent to the Esperanto Association of North America from the Societo Patrina Esperantista de Cilo:
"We are happy to inform you of the great triumph which our Societo Patrina Esperantista de Cilo attained in the First Pan-American Scientific Congress, which fully approved the proposals presented by Messrs. Kontreras, Biaut and Novoa Orellana, copies of which we enclose. Our eminent president, Sro. Eduardo Fabres, who introduced Esperanto into the Congress, was, for various reasons beyond his control, unable to attend.
To carry out this duty, so splendidly started Santiago de Chile, came official delegates of the twenty governments of the American nations.
"As you see, the United States government is charged with the fulfillment of the arrangement of a Universal Congress to work for the acceptance of an international language.
"Therefore the responsibility falls upon you, the North American samideanoj, to urge these proposals upon the government of the United States and to obtain the early assembling of the World Congress.
"We beg you to communicate the various proposals to all bodies affiliated with you, to facilitate the final triumph.

## THE CONSTITUTION

## of the

ESPERANTO ASSOCIATION OF NORTH AMERICA. Article I-Name.
The name of this association shall be the Esperanto Association of North America.

> Article II-Objects.

The objects of this association shall be the furtherance of the study and use of the International Auxiliary Language, Esperanto, according to the Fundamento Zamenhofa, and, in particular, the formation of a close union between and among all individuals and organizations studying or using Esperanto.

## Article III-Membership.

Any individual studying or being interested in Esperanto and any organization, club, society, or association interested in Esperanto or devoting a part or the whole of its time to the study or use of the same shall be eligible to membership in this association.

> Article IV-Officers.

Section 1.-The officers of this association shall be a president, vice-president, secretary, treasurer, and general council.

Section 2.-The general council shall be composed of ten or more members who shall be elected annually by the voting members of the association. according to Article VII, Sections 3 and 4, each
"Our promise and our duty are fulfilled; and now the last step remains to you.
"The Pan-American honor is in your hands. Defend it! Labor! Go forward and you will win!
"Kindly accept, victors of the future, the greetings of your friends, who have fulfilled their duty."

To carry out this duty, so splendidly started by our Chilean brethren and now given to us to finish, will need the help and co-operation of every Esperantist in North America. Eivery scientific and educational magazine should receive articles about this action and about Esperanto; every teacher, board of education, and college trustee should be acquainted with it; and every congressman and senator bombarded with petitions to carry out the wish of Pan-American Scientists. Let every member of the Esperanto Association of North America feel that it is his special duty to do one or all of the above duties at once, notifying the Secretary just what he is doing, so that we may all work in unison.

Paragrafo I-Nomo.
La nomo de tiu ĉi Asocio estos la Esperantista Asocio de Norda Ameriko.

Paragrafo 1I-Celoj.
La celoj de tiu ĉi Asocio estos la plivastigado de la studado kaj uzado de la Internacia Helpa Lingvo, Esperanto, laŭ la Fundamento Zamenhofa, kaj precipe la formado de intima unuigo inter çiuj individuoj kaj organizajoj kiuj studas aũ uzas Esperanton.

## Paragrafo III-Anigo.

Ciu individuo kiu studas Esperanton aŭ intersiĝas pri ĝi, kaj ĉiu organizajo, klubo, societo, aŭ asocio kiu interesigas pri Esperanto aŭ kiu donas partan, aŭ sian tutan, tempon al la studado aŭ uzado de Esperanto, estos aniĝinda en tiu cai Asocio.

## Paragrafo IV—Estraro.

Sekcio 1. La oficistoj de tiu ài Asocio estos Prezidanto, Vicprezidanto, Sckretario, Kasisto, kaj Generala Konsilantaro.
Sekcio 2. La Generala Konsilantaro konsistos el dek añ pli multe da anoj, kiujn la voĉdonaj anoj de la Asocio elektos ciujare laũ Paragrafo VII, Sekcioj 3 kaj 4. Ciu konsilanto havos unu
councilor casting one vote for each paying member in his division. It shall have full charge of the general policy of this association, and shall exercise general supervision over its work.

Section 3.-The general council shall elect annually the president, vice-president, secretary and treasurer of this association.

Sction 4.-The general council shall appoint such committees as may be necessary for the proper management of the affairs of the association.

Section 5.-The president, vice-president, secretary, and treasurer shall perform all such duties as usually appertain to their respective offices.

Article V-Committees.
Section 1.-There shall be three standing committees of this association, the members of which shall continue in office at the pleasure of the general council. These committees shall be appointed annually by the general council. and shall be: Committee on Propaganda, committee on Publication, and committee on Statistics and Examinations. Each of said committees shall consist of five members of this association, one of whom shall be designated as the chairman.

Section 2.-The Propaganda committee shall have, subject to the general council and the executive committee, full charge and control of the propaganda work of the association, and the organization of local societies and groups where no state organization has been formed.

Section 3.-The committee of Publication shall have, subject to the general council and the executive committee, full charge of all the publications of this association; the control of any journal issued by, or under the auspices of this association: the preparation of suitable Esperanto literature; the maintenance of a book office where Esperanto publications may be kept for sale: and the supply of literary material for the propaganda committee.

Section 4.-The committee on Statistics and Examinations shall have, subject to the general council and the executive committee, full charge of all records and statistics pertaining to the spread of Esperanto in the United States and elsewhere, including full records and statistics concerning the members of this association. It shall have charge of all examinations conducted by this association, and of the granting of all Certificates of Profciency and study. (atestoj.)

Section 5.-The chairman of the three standing committees shall form the executive committee. It shall have full charge and control. subject to the general council. of all the work of this association. Article VI-Dues and Votes.
Section 1.-Individual members of this association shall nay annually in advance to the treasurer the sum of twenty-five cents. and shall be entitled to one vote.

Section 2.-Organizations. clubs, societies. or as. sociations shall pay annuallv. in advance. to the treasurer of this association the sum of twentr-five cents per capita for each enrolled member of such nroqnization. Members of such organizations may vote as individuals or as a body through their dulv elected representatives.

## Article VII-Elections.

Spctinn 1.-Applicants for membershin in thia oconciation shall be plected by the executive com: mittre.

Section 2.-The general council shall be elected st the annual meeting of the association. Nominations signed by at least five members may be

Sekcio 4. La Generala Konsilantaro nomos tiajn komitatojn kiaj estos necesaj por konvene direktadi la aferojn asociajn.
Sekcio 5. La Prezidanto, Vicprezidanto, Sekretario, kaj Kasisto plenumos ĉiajn devojn kiaj kutime rilatas al iliaj respektivaj oficoj.

> Paragrafo V—Komitatoj.

Sekcio 1. Tri Konstantaj Komitatoj de tiu ĉi Asocio estos nomataj, kies anoj tenos oficojn laũ la volo de la Generala Konsilantaro. Tiuj âi komitatoj estos nomataj ĉiujare de la Generala Konsilartaro, kaj estos la jenaj: La Komitato por Propaganda; la Komitato por Publikigado; kaj la Komitato por Statistiko kaj Ekzamenoj. Ciu el tiuj ci komitatoj konsistos el kvin anoj de tiu ĉi Asocio, unu el kiuj estos nomata komitatestro.

Sekcio 2. La Komitato por Propagando, sub la kontrolo de la Generala Konsilantaro kaj de la Aga Komitato, tute direktados kaj kontrolos la aferojn propagandajn de la Asocio, kaj la organizadon de lokaj societoj kaj grupoj kie nenia stata organizajo jam estos efektivigita.
Sekcio 3. La Komitato por Publikigado, sub la kontrolo de la Generala Konsilantaro kaj de la Aga Komitato tute direktados ciajn eldonajojn de tiu ai Asocio; kontrolos ciun gazeton eldonotan de tiu ca Asocio añ sub gia patroneco. Gi zorgos la preparadon de alcelaj Esperantaj verkajoj; la subtenadon de libra oficejo kie eldonajoj Esperantaj povos vendigi; kaj la alprovizon de propagandiloj por la Komitato por Propagando.

Sekcio 4. La Komitato por Statistiko kaj Ekzamenoj, sub la kontrolo de la Cenerala Konsilantaro kaj de la Aga Komitato, havos tutan direkton de ciuj enskribajoj kaj statistikajoj kiuj rilatas la disvastiĝon de Esperanto en la Unuigitaj Statoj (Usono) kaj aliloke, inklusive de plenaj enskribajoj kaj statistikajoj rilataj al la anoj de tiu ci Asocio. Gi direktados ciujn ekzamenojn farotajn de tiu ci Asocio, kaj la aljuğadon de ©iuj Atestoj pri Kapableco kaj Lernado.

Sekcio 5. La komitatestroj de la tri Konstantaj Komitatoi estos la Aga Komitato. Sub la kontrolo de la Generala Konsilantaro, gi tute direktados kaj kontrolos la aferojn de tiu éi Asocio.

## Paragrafo VI-Kotizajoj kaj Vocdonoj.

Sekcio 1. La individuaj anoj de tiu ci Asocio ĉiujare antaŭpagos al la Kasisto la sumon de dudek kvin cendoj ( 513 spesoj) kaj rajtos unu voĉon.

Sekcio 2. Organizajoj, kluboj. societoi aŭ asocioj cíujare antaŭpagos al la Kasisto de tiu ©i Asocio la sumon de dudek kvin cendoj ( 513 spesoj) pro ĉiu registrita ano de tia organizajo. La anoj de tiaj anaroj rajtos voĉdoni kiel individuoj aŭ kiel organizajo per siaj laŭregule elektitaj reprezentantoj.

## Paragrafo VII—Elektoj.

Sekcio 1. Petantoj por anigí en tiu ci Asocio estos elektataj de la Aga Komitato.

Sekcio 2. Oni elektos le Generalan Konsilantaron êe la ciujara kunveno de la Asocio. Iatempe en la daŭro de tri monatoj antau la kunvena
sent to the secretary at any time within three months prior thereto and shall be published by him in the official organ of the association in the issue immediately preceding the said meeting.

Section 3.-For the purpose of electing the general council, the following territorial divisions shall be made:

1-The states of Maine, New Hampshire, Vermont, Massachusetts, Rhode Island and Connecticut shall form the New England Division, and elect one councilor.

2-The state of New York shall form the New York division and elect one councilor.
3-The states of Pennsylvania and New Jersey shall form the Eastern division and elect one councilor.

4-The states of Delaware, Maryland, Virginia, Kentucky, Tennessee, and the District of Columbia shall form the Capitol division and elect one councilor.
5-The states of North Carolina, South Carolina, Georgia, Florida, Alabama, Mississippi and Louisiana, together with Porto Rico shall form the Southern division and elect one councilor.
6-The states of Ohio, Indiana and West Virginia shall form the Ohio Valley division and elect one councilor.

7-The states of Illinois, Michigan and Wisconsin shall form the Central division and elect one councilor.

8-The states of Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Nebraska and Missouri shall form the Prairie division and elect one councilor.
9-The states of Kansas, Oklahoma, Arkansas and Texas shall form the Southwestern division and elect one councilor.

10-The states of Montana, Idaho, Wyoming, Utah, Colorado, Nevada, California, Oregon and Washington, together with New Mexico, Arizona, Alaska and Pacific possessions shall form the Western division and elect one councilor.

11-The Dominion of Canada shall form the Canadian division and elect one councilor.
Section 4.-Divisions outside of the territories herein named may be created by vote of the general council; each of such divisions shall elect one councilor.
Section 5.-If no nominations are made, or if no councilor is elected in any division, the general council, immediately after its organization, shall elect some member of the association to fill such vacancy until the next general election. Vacancies in the general council occurring during the year shall be filled at once by the remaining members of the council.
Section 6.-Whenever one-fifth of the members of any division shall petition the general council for the exercise of the right of recall the council shall order an election held after thirty days' notice; and if a majority of the members in such division shall vote for the recall of its councilor, he shall stand thereby removed from office, and a successor, a resident in the same division, shall be elected by the council. He shall hold office until the general election, unless recalled by the division which he represents.

Section 7.-Immediately after its election the general council shall elect the remaining officers of the association and appoint the standing committees.

Sekcio 3. Por la elekto de la Generala Konsilantaro, oni faros la jenajn teritoriajn apartajojn:

1. La statoj Majno, Nov-Hampsiro, Vermonto, Masaĉusetso, Rod-Insulo, kaj Konektikuto estos la Nov-Angluja apartojo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
2. La stato Nov-Jorko estos la Nov-Jorka apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
3. La statoj Pensilvanio kaj Nov-Jerzo estos la Orienta apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
4. La Statoj Delavaro, Marilando, Virginio, Kentuko, Tenesio, kaj la Distrikto Kolumbia estos la Kapitola apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
5. La Statoj Nord-Karolino, Sud-Karolino, Georgio, Florido, Alabamo, Misisipo, kaj Luiziano, kune kun Porto Riko, estos la Suda apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
6. La statoj Ohio, Indiano, kaj Okcidenta Virginio estos la Ohiovala apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
7. La Statoj Ilinojo, Micigano, kaj Viskonsino estos la Centra apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
8. La Statoj Minesoto, Nord-Dakoto, Sud-Dakoto, Iovo, Nebrasko, kaj Misurio estos la Ebenaja apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
9. La statoj Kansaso, Oklahomo, Arkanso, kaj Tekso estos la Sudokcidenta apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
10. La statoj Montano, Idaho, Vajomingo, Utaho, Kolorado, Nevado, Kalifornio, Oregono, kaj Vasingtono, kune kun Nov-Meksiko, Arizono, Alasko, kaj la Pacifikaj Havajoj, estos la Okcidenta apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.
11. La Regiono de Kanado estos la Kanada apartajo, kaj elektos unu konsilanton.

Sekcio 4. Apartajoj ekster la limoj de la landoj diritaj povos esti voêdone faritaj de la Generala Konsilantaro; ciu el tiaj apartajoj elektos unu konsilanton.

Sekcio 5. Se ne estos pornomadoj, aŭ se oni ne elektos konsilanton en iu apartajo, la cenerala Konsilantaro, tuj post sia organizigo, elektos iun anon de la Asocio por plenigi tian mankajon gis la venonta generala elekto. Vakajojn en la Generala Konsilantaro, kiuj okazos en la daüro de la jaro, tuj plenigos la ceteraj anoj de la Konsilantaro.

Sekcio 6. Kiam ajn kvinono de la anoj en iu apartajo petos la Generalan Konsilantaron por la efektivigo de la revokrajto, la Konsilantaro ordonos ke elekto post tridektaga anta se la plimulto da anoj en tiu apartajo voedonos la revokon de sia konsilanto, li tuj cesos esti konsilanto, kaj la Konsilantaro elektos anstataŭe alian homon logantan en la sama apartajo. Tiu ci tenos oficon gis la generala elekto, se la apartajo, kiun li reprezentas, ne antaũe revokos lin.

Sekcio 7. Tuj post sia elektigo la Generala Konsilantaro elektos la ceterajn oficistojn de la Asocio, kaj la Konstantajn Komitatojn.

## Article VIII—Meetings.

Section 1.-The annual meeting of this association shall be held in the month of July or August in each year, at a time and place to be designated annually by the general council.

Section 2.-The general council shall meet annually for organization immediately after its election. It shall meet thereafter as often as it shall deem advisable, or at the call of its chairman.

Section 3.-The executive committee shall meet for organization immediately after the general council shall have appointed the standing committees. It shall thereafter meet, as often as it may deem necessary for the proper transaction of its business.
Section 4.-The standing committees shall meet at the call of their respective chairmen.
Section 5.-At all meetings of this association, and of the general council, representation and voting by proxy shall be permissible. All proxies to be valid, shall be in writing, duly signed and witnessed, and bearing the date of issuance, and the name of a chosen representative or substitute.

## Article IX-Quorum.

Section 1.-At any meeting of this association, a quorum shall consist of twenty-five persons, entitled to vote.
Section 2.-At any meeting of the general council, a quorum shall consist of five members.

Section 3.-At any meeting of the executive committee, a quorum shall consist of two members.
Section 4.-At any meeting of a standing committee, a quorum shall consist of three members.

## Article X-Affiliation.

Organizations other than those devoting their time principally to the study and propaganda of Esperanto, which are interested in the aims of this association, may become affiliated societies, upon vote of the general council. Such organizations shall be entitled to the privileges of conventions, and shall have a voice, but not a vote, through a duly elected fraternal delegate in the annual meeting of the association and council.

## Article XI-A mendments.

This constitution shall not be amended, except by a two-thirds vote at any annual meeting of the association. Notice of any proposed amendment shall be published in the official journal, or sent to each member of the association at least thirty days prior to the annual meeting, otherwise such amendment shall not be considered.

## Article XII—By-Laws.

Section 1.-Immediately after their election, the general council shall cause to be prepared suitable by-laws, not repugnant to the provisions of this constitution, for the government of this association. When such by-laws have been adopted by the general council, they shall not be amended, or altered, or added to, except by a two-thirds vote of the members of the general council.

Section 2.-The by-laws of this association as adopted by any general council shall be binding on any subsequent general council, except as amended, in the manner prescribed in the preceding section.

## Paragrafo VIII-Kunvenoj.

## EATRAC'IS FROM BI-LAWS

OFFICLAL TITLE'S
It is suggested that organizations of Esperantists adopt, the following titles:

Urganzations of less than 10 persons: "Classes."

Organizations of not less than 10 persons: "Groups."

Organizations of not less than 25 persons: "Clubs" or "Societies."
A tederation of organizations representing a majority of Esperantists in any one state, having adopteu a constitution shall be known as a state Association.

## FEES

All organizations wishing to be registered as such in the monthly organ of the E. A. of N. A., and in the Amerika Aaresaro shall pay a registration fee of firty cents yearly and suall assume the duties of collecting the fee of twenty-five cents per capita from each and all members of said organization and forward the amount together with the name and address of each member to the secretary of the E. A. of N. A.
votes
Members are expected to pay but one fee and entitled only to one vote. Whether they shall elect to vote directly or through their organizations is a matter that lies wholly between the organizations and the members.
Every membership paid in shall be credited to the division to which it belongs, and the total number of memberships paid in each division shall represent the voting power of its councilor in the aftairs of the E. A. of N. A.

## EXAMINATIONS

The general rules for the conduct of examinations for the diplomas of the Association are in charge of the Committee on Statistics and Examinations. The Committee provided for two examinations, the Preliminary for the Atesto pri Lernado and the Advanced for tae Atesto pri Kapableco.

The first, requiring a good knowledge of the grammar and ability to read, write and transiate easy prose, may be given by Local Examining Boards and Special Examiners, or by correspondence with the Central Examining Board. The registration fee is ten cents, and examination fee $\$ 1.25$.

The Advanced Examination is given only by correspondence. This requires a very thorough knowledge of grammar and syntax, and ability to write and translate into Esperanto more difticult prose. The papers of this examination, identified by number only, are given one of the three Central Examiners for marking, and his decision is final. The fee for registration is twenty-five cents, the examination fee $\$ 2.50$.

## THE PAN-AMERICAN CONGRESS

## LA TUTAMERIKA KONGRESO

Under the patronage of all governments of both Americas there was organized the PanAmerican Scientific Congress, whose delegated members represented not only the national governments, but also many of the most important universities and institutes. For the examination of this congress many subjects were presented, and because of its high and authoritative character we cannot lightly estimate its decisions. It fully and unconditionally approved Esperanto! Here is the text of its decision:
"Considering, that the Esperanto language is a human blessing, practically used by thousands of people in all the civilized nations; and that it is a factor which aims toward the adoption of the ideals of human happiness and is therefore of special interest to America, the future field of action of the two great civilizations which confront each other politically and commercially, the First Pan-American Scientific Congress recommends Esperanto as a neutral international language which deserves an important place in the programs of primary instruction of the American nations."

This text, drafted by Sro. Kontreras, vice president of the Societo Patrina Esperantista de Cilo, was approved by acclamation by the Committee on Pedagogy and Philosophy, which reported it to the whole Congress for general approbation. Not only did the whole Congress approve it, but it approved also the following plan, immensely important for Esperanto:
"The Fourth Scientific Congress (First Pan-American) decides to express to the American governments the pleasure with which it would view the call for a congress to which would come official representatives of all civilized countries, with the purpose of solving the problem of the adoption of a neutral international auxiliary idiom; and

EN la lasta Decembro kunvenis en Santiago de Cilo plej grava kongreso. Sub la patronado de ĉiuj registaroj el ambaŭ Amerikoj, estis organizita la Tutamerika Scienca Kongreso, kies delegitaj membroj reprezentis ne sole la naciajn registarojn, sed ankaŭ multajn el la plej gravaj universitatoj kaj institutoj. Al la esplorado de tiu $\hat{\text { cii }}$ kongreso estis prezentita multaj temoj, kaj pro ĝia alta kaj aŭtorita karaktero oni ne povas malpeze taksi giajn decidojn.

Gi plene kaj senkondiĉe aprobis Esperanton! Jen la teksto de ĝia decido:
"Konsiderante, ke la lingvo Esperanto estas homa bono praktikata de miloj de homoj en tutaj la civilizitaj nacioj, kaj ke gi estas faktoro kiu emas al la alpreno de la idealoj de la homa feliĉeco, kaj, tial de speciala intereso por Ameriko, estonta kampo de agado de la du grandaj civilizacioj kiuj politike kaj komerce sin rigardas frunte, la Unua Kongreso Scienca Tutamerika rekomendas Esperanton kiel internacia lingvo neŭtrala, kiu devas havi gravan lokon inter la programoj de la unua instruado de la Amerikaj Nacioj."

Tiu teksto, redaktata de Sro. Kontreras, vicprezidanto de la Societo Patrina Esperantista de Cilo, estis aprobita per aklamado de la Sekcio por la Pedadogio kaj Filozofio, kiu reportis ĝin al la tuta kongreso por generala aprobo. Ne sole la tuta kongreso $\hat{g}$ in aprobis, sed aprobis ankaŭ la sekvantan por Esperanto gravegan planon:
"La Kvara scienca Kongreso (Unua Tutamerika) decidas esprimi al la amerikaj registaroj la plezuron kun kiu gi vidus la alvokon al unu Kongreso al kiu alvenus oficialaj reprezentantoj el la civilizitaj landoj, kun la celo por solvi pri la adopto de idiomo neŭtrala helpa internacia; kaj
"Gi interkonsentas soliciti la Usonan Re-
"It agrees to urge upon the government of the United States of North America that, under its grand auspices, this desire of the Scientific Congress may be effected."

We cannot overestimate the importance of the Scientific Congress. There were present many diplomats, and nearly all the Latin-American countries named as heads of their delegations their respective ministers to Chile. The president of the Congress was Sro. Lisboa, the Brazilian minister. Among other eminent persons was Sro. Amadon, of Argentine, Sro. Elizalde, of Ecuador, General Uribe-Uribe, of Colombia, and Dr. Canton, of the Argentine Chamber of Deputies. Several members of the Congress were Esperantists, among whom El Diario, a newspaper of Santiago, mentions M. Sa. Vianne, of Brazil, and Sro. Claro C. Dassens, of Argentine.

The Second Pan-American Congress will have its session in Washington, commencing on the 12th of October, 1911. With sufficient energy. and persistence, the users and advocates of Esperanto in the world can realize an official world congress.

Will it take place?
gistaron de Norda Ameriko por ke, sut ĝiaj aŭspicoj estu efektivigita tiu ĉi dezirc de la Scienca Kongreso."

La gravecon de la Scienca Kongreso mem oni ne povas tro alte taksi. Estis multaj diplomatistoj, kaj preskaŭ ĉiuj el la LatinAmerikaj landoj nomis kiel estrojn de siaj delegacioj siajn ministrojn al Cilo. La prezidanto de la Kongreso estis Sro. Lisboa, la Brazila ministro. Inter la aliaj eminentuloj estis Sro. Amadon, el Arĝentina, Sro. Elizalde, el Ecuador, Gen. UribeUribe, el Colombia, Dro. Canton, prezidanto de la Arĝentina parlamento. Kelkaj membroj de la Kongreso estis Esperantistoj, inter kiuj El Diario, jurnalo de Santiago, nomas Sro. M. Sa. Vianne, el Brazil, kaj Sro. Claro C. Dassens, el Arĝentino.

La Dua Tutamerika Kongreso havos gian kunsidon en Washington, komencante je la 12a de Oktobro 1911. Kun suficee da energio kaj persisteco, la esperantistoj kaj esperantanoj de la mondo povos efektivigi tutmondan oficialan kongreson.

Estas notinde, ke la franca jurnalo pri aeronaŭtiko, L'Aero, nun havas regule fakon en Esperanto. En cirkulero sendita, $\hat{g} \mathrm{i}$ diras:
"La senĉesaj kaj miregigantaj progresoj de la aerflugado igas pli kaj pli certa, kaj post tre mallonga tempo, unu reciprokan kaj pli intiman intermiksiĝon de la popoloj. Niaj morgaŭaj aerflugiloj facile veturos je la rapideco de 200 kilometroj hore kaj ê pli. Je tiu momento, verŝajne tre proksima, kiam la scienco preskaŭ estos neniiginta la distancojn, estos necesege elekti internacian lingvon kiel interŝangilo inter la malsamaj popoloj de l'tero, ĉar oni ne devas forgesi,
ke sur la tuta mondo estas parolataj cirkaŭ mil malsamaj lingvoj aŭ idiomoj. Estas do necesege, ke apud la mirindaj progresoj efektivigitaj en la materiaj transportiloj inter la popoloj, okazu korespondaj progresoj en la intelektaj komunikiloj. Nu! tiu lasta progreso jam hodiaŭ ekzistas; ĝi estas tute kreata, kaj oni nur bezonas uzi ĝin, estas la lingvo Esperanto. En nia numero de la 7a de Januaro 1909, ni komencos kurson de Esperanto en 52 lecionoj faritan de So Henri de Coppet, konata profesoro jam de multaj jaroj en Parizo, kies kursoj estas tre ŝatataj de l'publiko."

Per la sendo de peto per karto ilustrita al Sro. Max. Butin, Kronprinzenstrasse 33, Bad Godesburg, Germanujo, oni povas ricevi gvidfolio pri la tiel nomata Rejna Esperantujo. La Esperantistoj de Bad Godesburg volas varbi al sia bela loko turistojn kiuj parolas Esperanton.

## POR LA KOMENCANTO

I note that Privat in "Fifty Lessons" and O'Connor in his Complete Text-book translate "kiel vi sanas" by "how are you?" I recall that Dr. Zamenhof gives "kiel vi fartas" or "kiel vi statas." The dictionaries agree in translating "sani" as "to be well," Is sanas as good Esperanto in the above conection?

Such a use of sanas may be considered quite as good as that of the roots farti and stati, all three being used in the sense of "to be well (or ill)" in sentences relating to the state of one's health. The idea of being well rather than ill is of course uppermost in the root sani, but as questions of courteous inquiry generally allude to the health, not the illness, of the person concerned, the usage is a natural one.

Please translate the word "senkulpigante" in the following sentence from page 23 of "Tutmonda Ainekdotaro." We have made it "weithout blaming," but that does not seem to fit: "La viro eliris sin senkulpigante, sed restis tute proksime."

The translation is: "The man went out, excusing himself, but remained quite near."

What does "oratorumu" mean, in "Letero al Iuj Esperantistoj" in the September Esperantisto? Is the use of "ĉe" in this article correct, and what does "verdigota mondo" mean?

The verb oratorumu has very much the same sense here as our semi-colloquial "orate." The use of $\hat{c} e$ in the same article is perfectly correct. Beside its literal use to express location in place or time, "êe" occurs in this analogous figurative use. The expression "verdigota mondo" is somewhat idiomatic, and refers to the dissemination of the language whose followers wear the green star.

In the September Esperantisto, in "Li ne Timis," is "tagon post tago" correct, likezvise "kiu...savis knabinon de droni"' Does "Iudflugilon" in the same article mean kite?

The phrase tagon post tago is perfectiy correct, tagon being the accusative to express duration of time, while the second occurrence of the word is in the nominative because it is governed by a preposition. The use of the infinitive with $d e$, in the sentence quoted, is not correct, since this preposition is not one of the three (por, antă̆ ol, anstataŭ) which are used with the infinitive. The noun drono, "drowning," should have been used. Ludflugilo obviously means "kite" in this connection. The more usual order of composition in the word is flugludilo.

Is "virego" the correct word for "giant"?

Since the suffix -eg- indicates augmentation or intensity, virego would denote intensification of masculine characteristics in general. The word for "giant" in the mythological sense is giganto. The translation for "giant" in the sense of "person of great size" would be grandulo, in the sense of "person of great strength" would be fortegulo, etc. The adjectives expressing a similar sense are grandega, vastega, etc.

Negra kuiristino petis sian mastrinon ke tiu permesu sin foresti vendredon post tri semajnoj. "Car," si aldiris, "mi volas ĉeesti la enterigon de mia fianĉo."
"Sed kiel vi konas ke li efektive mortos? Neniu povas koni la tagon de la morto akurate. Eble via fianco ne mortos."
"Je-es," diris la negrino iom dubeme. Tiam pli certeme, "sed mi ja scias ke li mortos tiam. Oni pendigos lin!"

Albert Prior estis junulo kiu pli ofte sekvis sian propran volon ol taŭgis al li. Liaj parencoj, patro, patrino, frato kaj fratinoj, ĉiam cedis al li, kaj li sajnis pensi ke la mondo devas fari same. Pri tio la mondo ne konsentis. Bedaŭrinde, la unua persono kiu kontraŭstaris lian fortan volon estis virino-preskaŭ knabino. Si ne nur absolute rifuzis edzinigi kun li, sed eĉ amikiêi, kaj tion diris. Li tre koleris, kompreneble, sed ne kredis sin serioza. Neniu knabino ne freneza daŭrigus rifuzi junulon kiu havas tiajn atendajojn. Sed, aŭdinte ke si fianĉiniĝis kun juna Bowen, la telegrafisto ĉe la stacidomo, la kolero de Prior igis neregebla. Li dccidis fortimigi Bowen el la vilago kaj vizitis la telegrafejon tiucele; sed Bowen ne ceeestas, ĉar li laboras nokte. La alia telegrafisto, ridante, sciante nenion pri la afero, informas ke versajne li trovus Bowen êe Fraŭlino Johnson, kiu logadas ĉe sia onklino, ĉar la propraj gepatroj jam mortis.

Prior grincis al si la dentojn kaj foriris. Vizitante Fraŭlinon Johnson, li trovis ŝin sola. Ili malpacis kaj sekvis-tragedio! Li pafis sin kvar fojojn, rezervante al si la aliajn du kuglojn. Sed li efektive estis malkuragulo kaj hundaĉo en la koro kaj fine ne povas mortigi sin, tial penis forkuri. Tamen, jen la unua maltrafo de la elektro. Oni telegrafis lian pris.sribon ĉien kaj post du tagoj kaptis
lin ne malproksime de la vilago. Reveniginte la mortiginton, oni enkarcerigis lin. Publika opinio, ĉiam senerara kaj ciopova, nun asertas sin. Post la noktigo kolektig̣is ĉirkaŭ la malliberejon multaj urbanoj kiuj malmulte parolas sed kiuj ne estas pro tio malpli dangeraj. Inter ili unu portas ŝnuron kaj signife montras per la fingro dikan branĉon de apuda arbo. Krioj similaj al la bojaĉoj de luparo aŭdiĝas kaj ili laŭte batas la pordon de la malliberejo.
"Linĉu lin! Linĉu lin! Gardisto, liveru al ni la ŝlosilojn!" kriegis la amaso. La policestro bone konis sian devon sed sanceliĝis. Tehnike tiu ĉi estas senlega kanajlaro, sed efektive gi konsistas el liaj samurbanoj, liaj amikoj-juste indignaj pro la terura krimo. Li povus ordoni pafi sur ili kaj eble liaj subuloj obeus. unu, du dekdu eble mortus, teknike laŭ la leĝo; tamen kiu profitus pro tio? Por savi, dum iom da tempo, la vivon al krimulo kiu certe meritas tian sorton kian la leĝo donos al li. Tial la policestro tordas al si la manojn, laŭte plendas kontraŭ la sorto kiu venigas al li tian krizon dum lia oficperiodo, kaj faras-nenion. Laŭtigas la krioj de la amaso ĝis kiam ilin aŭdas la oreloj de la tremanta malliberigito, kaj tuj aperas ŝvitgutoj sur la frunto. Sendube oni intencas tuj ekzekuti lin.
"Kion fari?" demandis la gardisto. "Ekliveri la ŝlosilojn?"
"Mi ne scias kion fari," kriis la policestro malespere. "Cu utilus paroli kun ili ?"
"Tute ne."
"Kredeble mi povus ordoni ke ili foriru kaj pafi sur ilin se ili ne obeus."
" 1 'ia estas la leĝo," respondis maldolĉe la gardisto.
"Kion vi farus, se vi okupus mian oficon?"
"Mi ?" diris la gardisto. "Ho, mi tuj donus al ili la s̀losilojn kaj permesus ke li pendigu. Tio ŝparus al vi la malfelicon kaj plie, se vi pafos sur ilin vi certe mortigos tiujn kiuj nun urgas ke la pendigemuloj iru hejmen. En tia amaso ciam trovigas senkulpulo kaj li estas tiu kiu pafiĝas."
"Donu do al ili la ŝlosilojn, sed ne diru, pro Dio, ke mi permesas. Morgaŭ ili bedaŭros. Vi scias ke mi estas elektito sed vi nur dungito, sekve ne estas grave al vi kion oni diros."
"Bone," respondis la gardisto, "mi estos responda."

Sed la ŝlosiloj ne liveriĝis. Subite cesis la bruego. Junulo kun pala vizaĝo kaj ruĝaj okuloj starigas sur la muron kiu cirkaŭas la korton. Li levas la manon kaj sekvas tuja silento. Ciuj rekonas ke li estas Bowen, la telegrafisto kies fianĉino $\hat{s} i$ estis.
"Sinjoroj," li krias, la klara voĉo al ciuj aŭdebla, "ne faru tion. Ne malpurigu tiamaniere la bonan nomon de nia vilaĝo. Neniu iam linĉiĝis en nia distrikto, nek en la ŝtato, laŭ mia scio. Ni ne komencu. Se mi timus ke iel la mizera krimulo evitus sian sorton-se mi timus ke lia mono iel savus lin-mi ja estus la unua helpi vin rompi la pordon kaj pendigi lin al la plej proksima arbo, kaj vi tion bone scias."

La aŭskultantoj laŭte aplaŭdis. "Sed li ne povos eviti ĝin. Lia mono ne savos lin. Li pendiĝos laŭ la leğo. Ne kredu ke mi predikas kompaton-tio estas la vengo!" kaj Bowen minacas la malliberejon per la pugno. "Tiu mizerulo estas en infero post kiam li unue aŭdis viajn kriojn. Li restos en infero, çar li estas malkuraĝulo, gis kiam la tremantaj kruroj portos lin sur la esafodon. Mi volas ke li restu en tiu chi infero gis kiam li trafalos en la alian, se alia ekzistas. Mi volas ke li suferu la saman mizeron kian li kaŭzis. Se ni lin pendigus li tuj mortus. Mi volas ke tiu krimulo mortu laŭ la malrapida, senkompata krueleco de leğo."

Aŭdinte tiujn vortojn eĉ la plej sangavidaj inter la ĉirkaŭantoj tremas kaj ekkomprenas, rigardante lian vizaĝon, preskaŭ nehoman de kolerego, ke lia venĝsoifo sajnigas ilian, kontraste,
preskaŭ senkulpa.
La parolo de Bowen disigis la kunvenon. Tiu kiu portis la ŝnuron transjetis gin en la korton, kriante al la policestro, "Prizorgu ĝin, maljunulo; vi bezonos ĝin."

Renkontinte Bowen poste, la policestro diras, metante manon amike sur la sultron, "Bowen, knabo mia, vi estas bonulo kaj faris al mi grandan servon. Se iam kaptos vin la malfeliĉo kaj mankas la helpo, venu al mi. Se mono aŭ influo utilos vi ricevos ction kion mi havas."
"Dankon," respondis Bowen mallonge. Guste tiam ne plaĉas al li la gratuloj.

Kiel profetis Bowen, ja fariĝis, ke la mono kaj influo de la Prior familio ne utilis, kaj oni kondamnis Arthur al la pendigo gis la morto, je la sesa matene, septembro la dekduan. Tiele kontentigis la opinio publika.

Sed tuj post la decido pri la sorto de la junulo, kurioza sango montrigas. Multe da simpatio ricevas la familio kaj eventuale ankaŭ la kondamnito mem. Ofte aŭdiĝas tiu frazo pri la plej malbona uzo al kiu oni povas kondamni homon. Virinoj sendis al Prior bukedojn kaj diris unu al la alia ke eĉ se li estas mortiginta Fraŭlinon Johnson, pendigi lin tute ne revivigos sin. Tamen nur malmultaj parolis pri sid, ĉar ĉiuj jam forgesis sin-krom unu, kiu, eksciante la malkonstantecon de publika opinio, grincas al si la dentojn. Virinoj rondiris kun kompatpetoj kiujn multaj-predikistoj unue-subskribas, ĉiuj-esceptinte unu, kaj ploranta sinjorino eĉ urĝis lin, memorigante ke "la vengo apartenas al Dio."
"Sed Dio havas siajn perilojn," diris Bowen maldolce, "kaj mi juras al vi, sinjorino, ke se vi sukcesos prokrastigi la ekzekuton de tiu hundaĉo, mi mem estos la perilo de la dia vengo."
"Ho, ne diru tion," petegis la sinjorino. "Via subskribo havus tian efekton. Foje vi estis nobla kaj savis lin de la linĉo; estu nobla denove kaj savu lin de la eŝafodo."
"Mi certe ne subskribos. Via peto, se vi pardonos min, estas al mi insulto. Via sukceso faros el mi mortiginton, ĉar mi mortigos lin kiam li eliĝos, eê se tio estos post dudek jaroj. Vi parolas
pri la linĉo: tia laboro kian vi faras, justigas gin. Sajnas ke ciiuj nun simpatias kun vi, bedaŭrinde, sed la plej proksima mortigo kiu okazos tuj sekvigos de linĉo pro via hodiaŭa sukceso."

Sopirante la sinjorino foriris, malĝojigite de la malboneco de la homa naturo, estante ja pri tio tute prava.

La familio de Prior estas riĉa kaj influhava. Vivanto havas multajn helpantojn; enterigito havas malmultajn kiuj krias al la justeco. Petoj de ĉiuj partoj de la ŝtato superŝutis la guberniestron kaj tiu bonkorulo, kies okuloj rigardis nur lian propran reelekton, ne scias kion fari. Se iu povus montri matematike al li ke tia ago aŭ alia gajnus aŭ malgajnus tiom da balotoj, li tuj scius sian devon, sed liaj propraj konsilantoj ne estas certaj. Fraro pri tia malgranda afero facile povus perdi al li la elekton. Jen famoj aŭdiĝas ke la guberniestro intencas komuti la sentencon en malliberigon dum la tuta vivo; jen la famoj senkreditigas.

Oni pretekstas, sajne juste, ke certe malliberigo ĝis la morto estos sufiĉe da puno al junulo; sed ĉiuj bone scias ke tio estas nur komenco de la batalo kaj ke iu estonta guberniestro fine cedos kaj liberigos la junulon.

Gis septembro la dedua la ŝtatestro faris nenian signon. Ekdejorante tiun nokton Bowen renkontis la policestron.
"Cu vi jam ricevis ordonon prokrasti la ekzekuton?" diris li.

La demandito malğoje skuis al si la kapon. Neniam li pendigis homon kaj cetere ne deziras komenci.
"Ne," li diris: "kaj laŭ la sciigo kiun mi ricevis hodiaŭ la guberniestro ne sin intermetos. Li jam decidis ke la ordono de la juĝisto devos esti plenumata."
"Mi gojas pro tio," diris Bowen.
" $\mathrm{Nu}, m i$ ne gojas."
Post la naŭa horo ĉio kvietig̀is kaj Bowen sidadis legante la vesperan jurnalon. Subite venis voko de la telegrafa ricevilo kaj li respondis, skribante mehanike la depeŝon, ne komprenante ĝian signifon, sed, traleginte gin li saltis surpieden kaj blasfemis. Denove li legis gin, grincante al si la dentojn.
"Al la Policestro de Brentingville:
Ne procedu plu pri la ekzekuto de Prior, kiun mi prokrastas. Dokumentoj iros al vi laŭpoŝte hodiaŭ nokte.

Respondu kaj diru ke vi komprenas la depeŝon.

John Day, Guberniestro."
Bowen promenis kelkajn minutojn laŭlonge de la cambro, kun sulkigitaj brovoj. Li ne dubas pri siaj agoj sed deziras pripensi la aferon. Baldaŭ venis alia depeŝo, al Bowen persone, ordonante ke li tuj liveru la antaŭan depeŝon kaj sciigu la oficejon ce la kapitolo, ĉar la vivo de homo dependas de ĝi. Bowen respondis ke la depeŝo tuj liverigos. Preninte alian paperfolion li skribas jene:
"Al la Policestro de Brentingville:
Procedu pri la ekzekuto de Prior. Mi ne prokrastos gin. Respondu ke vi komprenas tiun ĉi depeŝon.

## John Day, Guberniestro."

Bedaŭrinde estas ke Bowen ne sentis ian memriproĉon pro tia ago. Ni ĉiuj amas pensi ke kiam homo faras krimon li devas ŝanceligi kaj senti iom da memriproĉo, eĉ se li poste procedas pri la afero. Bowen pensis sole pri la knabino mortigita, ne pri la vivanta mortiginto. Li vekis la dormantan depeŝportiston.
"Jen," li diris: "portu tion êi al la malliberejo kaj trovi la policestron. Se li ne troviĝas tie iru al lia logejo. Se li dormas veku lin. Sciigu ke respondo bezonigas. Donu al li paperfolion kaj post kiam li skribis, alportu ĝin al mi. Ne donu al iu alia la depeŝon. Cu vi aŭskultas?"

La knabo diris "Jes, sinjoro," kaj foriris en la nokton. Li revenis post tiom malmulte da tempo ke Bowen ekscias ke li estis trovinta la policestron maldormanta ĉe la malliberejo. La depeŝo al la guberniestro, skribita per la tremanta mano de la oficisto, legiĝis jene:
"Mi komprenas ke la ekzekuto farigos. Se vi ŝangos al vi la menson, pro Dio telegrafu kiel eble plej baldaŭ. Mi prokrastos la ekzekuton ĝis la lasta ebla momento permesata de la leĝo."

Bowen ne sendis tiun depeŝon sed alian. Li ridis-sed tuj cesis, alarmiginte, car la rido estas tre stranga.
"Mi miras $\hat{c} u$ mi estas tute sana en la menso?" li diris al si. "Mi dubas."

La nokto malrapide pasis. Reprezentanto de la asocio de jurnaloj envenis ĉirkaŭ la dekdua kaj sendis longan depeŝon. Bowen transsendis gin, hazardante ke la kapitola oficejo ne komunikos
kun la guberniestro pri gi. Li bone scias pri la mehanika, preskaŭ aŭtomata maniero laŭ kiu la telegrafistoj manumas eĉ la plej gravajn novajojn. Cetere estos tute neeble komuniki kun Brentingville gis la alveno de la tagotelegrafisto escepte per li, kaj tiam estos jam tro malfrue.

La jurnalisto, ankoraŭ restante, demandas ĉu pli ol unu telegrafisto dejoros post la ekzekuto.
"Mi havos longajn depeŝojn kiujn mi tre deziras ekspedi. Kelkaj jurnaloj eble presos specialan eldonon. Mi venigus kun mi telegrafiston sed mi supozis ke la guberniestro intencas prokrasti la afe-ron-kvankam la policestro ne sajnas tiel opinii," li aldonis.
"La tagotelegrafisto venos je la sesa: mi revenos tuj post matenmango kaj ni nepre sendos tiom kiom vi povos skribi," respondis Bowen, ne levante la okulojn de la ricevilo.
"Dankon. Bedaŭrinda afero, ĉu ne ?" "Tre."
"Mi opiniis ke la guberniestro fine cedos; ĉu vi?"
"Mi ne scias."
"Li estas vulpo, tiu maljunulo. Prokrastinte tiun cii ekzekuton li nepre perdus la venontan elekton. La publiko ne deziras lasi enkonduki la linĉon kaj malforta guberniestro estas amiko al Juĝisto Linĉo. Nu, bonan nokton; mi vidos vin matene."
"Bonan nokton," diris Bowen.
Venis fine la tagigo kiu venkis la lampojn en la telegrafejo. Bowen saltetis, preskaŭ kriante kiam audigas la sono de la sonorilo sur la preĝejo. Dek minutojn post la sesa alvenis la tagotelegrafisto.
" Nu , oni pendigis lin," li diras.
Bowen sin okupis faldante paperojn sur la tablo. Enmetinte ilin en la poŝon Ii diris:
"Jurnalisto venos tien $\hat{c} i$ post duonhoro kun multe da depeŝoj. Rapidu ilin kaj mi revenos por helpi vin antaŭ ol vi lacigos."

Irante al la malliberejo li renkontis la vidintojn de la ekzekuto. Tiuj diskutadas dormeme la aferon, plendante pri la nedeca horo elektita. Apud la pordo staras la policestro, kiu aperas tre pala kaj maltrankvila en la fresa matenlumo.
"Mi venas por min liveri al vi," diris

Bowen, antaŭ ol la oficisto povas saluti.
"Liveri vin? Kial do?"
"Pro la mortigo, kredeble."
"Ne decas ŝerci je ĉi tiu tempo, junulo," diras la oficisto, severe.
"Cu mi aspektas kiel humoristo? Legu tion ci."

Unue nekredemo, tiam horuro aperas sur la flava vizaĝo de la policestro dum li legas kaj relegas la depeŝon. Li ŝanceliĝas kontraŭ la muron. levante la manon por malpermesi fali.
"Bowen," li balbutas. "Cu vi-ĉu vi intencas diri al mi ke tiu ĉi depeŝo venis la pasintan nokton al mi adresita?"
"Jes."
"Kaj vi ne liveris?"
"Jes; plie mi liveris al vi falsajon."
"Kaj mi pendigis homon kontraŭ la ordono de la guberniestro?"
"Vi pendigis mortiginton, jes."
"Dio mia, Dio mia!" krias la policestro. Turninte sin al la muro, li metas kapon sur la brakon kaj ploras, tute sennervigita. La tutan nokton li ne dormis kaj neniam antaŭe pendigis homon.

Bowen kviete restadis gis la spasmo pasis. La oficisto sin turnis indigne at li, penante kaŝi la honton kiun li sentas, per kolero kontraŭ la vidinto.
"Kaj vi venas al mi, fripono, ĉar mi promesis ke mi helpos se vi iam petus tion?"
"Dek mil diabloj!" krias la junulo; "mi venis min liveri. Mi ne bedaŭras tion kion mi faris. Neniu petos la guberniestron pardoni min. Kion vi intencas fari al mi?"
"Mi ne scias, Bowen, mi ne scias," ŝanceligas la mizera oficisto, preskaŭ denove plorante. Li tute ne deziras pendigi duan homon, aparte unu el liaj personaj amikoj. "Mi devos konsulti la guberniestron. Mi iros al li per la unua vagonaro. Mi supozas ke vi ne forkuros?"
"Mi trovigos tie ĉi kiam vi deziros aresti min."

Tial Bowen iris returnen al la telegrafejo por helpi pri la laboro kaj la policestro iris viziti la guberniestron.

Nun okazas stranga afero. Por la unuafojo en la historio de la ŝtato êiuj jurnaloj unuanime laŭdas la konduton de la statestro, la organoj de lia propra partio ja varmege, eĉ la kontraŭuloj cedante ke li havas pli da kurago ol ili
estus kredintaj. Publika opinio, simile al la fama kato de historio, estis saltinta kaj laŭ tre decida maniero.
"Pro la nomo de ĉio mirinda, policestro," diras la konfuzigita ŝstatestro, "kiu subskribis tiujn petskribojn? Se la jurnalistoj deziris ke la homo pendiĝu, kial, pro diablo, ili ne dirus tion kaj ŝparus al mi tiom da malfelico? Nu , kiom da personoj scias pri tiu ĉi neliverita depeŝo ?"
"Vi kaj viaj subuloj tie ĉi kaj-"
"Ni certe diros nenion pri gi."
"Kaj en Brentingville estas mi kaj Bowen. Neniu pli."
" Nu , Bowen, pro si mem, diros nenion, kaj kompreneble vi silentos?"
"Kompreneble."
" Ni do ĉiuj silentu. Nenio okazos escepte ke la jurnalistoj iel ekscios. Nenia skribajo aperos en la rekordoj kaj mi bruligos ĉiujn aliajn dokumentojn."

Tiel farigis. Publika opinio estis denove rajtigita. La guberniestro estis triumfe reelektita kiel homo kiu havas grandegan kuraĝon.

Bestisto de cirko, serĉante elefanton kiu estis forkurinta, demandis al unu irlandano laboranta en kampo, "Cu vi eble vidis mian elefanton apud tie cii?"
" Ne ," respondis la irlandano. "Mi nur vidis kaŭĉukan beston mangantan karotojn per la vosto!"

William J. Bryan, kiu jus malsukcesis la trian fojon elektiĝi prezidanto de Usono, diris:

Post nelonge mi similos viron, kiu, iom ebria, volis ĉeesti publikan balon. Kiam li eniris la salonon la direktoro de la balo lin vidis kaj formetis eksteren. Li ree eniris la ĉambron kaj la direktoro ree lin forjetis. La trian fojon li provis eniri kaj la direktoro kaptis lin je la kolumo, lin forkondukis kaj jetis malsupren de la ŝtuparo. La ebriulo eksidis, enpensiĝis kaj diris:
"Aha, mi komprenas ĉion. Ili ne volas ke mi eniru!"

## KIAMANIERE HELPI AL LA LINGVA KOMITATO?

Cu la naciaj societoj, la grupoj, la izolaj Esperantistoj helpus al la Lingva Komitato aŭ al la Akademio, diskutante pri teoriaj reformoj en por tio speciale starigitaj Lingvaj Komisioj,-kiel proponis iu samideano?

Ne, certe ne! Tiel, kontraŭe, ili malpli-

Ne mankas interesplena laboro, kiu samtempe estos utila al ĉiuj, car per tia studado oni baldaŭ konvinkig̀os, ke mirinda,-p.ii mirinda filologie ol multaj samideanoj op-inias,-estas la ilo, kiun donis al ni D-ro Zamenhof.

Poste, tiujn laborojn, zorge redaktitajn, klare skribitajn, oni sendu al la Lingva Komitato.

Oni ne dubu, ke kun danko gi akceptos tian fruktoriĉan kunlaboradon!

Brockton, Mass.-The New Church Esperanto Society is affiliated with the E. A. of N. A., and already we feel the magnetic influence of the larger body. Our meetings are held fortnightly, and since the first gathering no session has been omitted. We have placed Esperanto books and literature on sale at the principal news stand of the city, and results have been encouraging. Our society would gladly receive communications from other Esperanto bodies, in Esperanto. They add much to our zeal and enthusiasm.-Fred R. French, Brockton, Mass.
Bradrord, Penna.-An Esperanto club has been formed at this place with about twenty members. Officers: Rev. Chas. E. Bingham, president; L. W. Barton, secretary and treasurer; T. J. Melvin, instructor.
Pittsbugah.-In Pittsburgh Esperanto circles. the most important event in February was the public meeting held in Carnegie Institute on the 17th under the auspices of the Pittsburgh Eisperanto Society at which the subject of discus. sion was "Esperanto as a Factor in the World Peace Movement." The chairman was Dr. Arthur A. Hamerschlag, Director of the Carnegie Technical Schools and the speaker of the evening was Rev. J. Leonard Levy, whose address. "World Peace and a Universal Language." was a brilliant effort. Major Lee S. Smith. President of the Chamber of Commerce, one of the most active advocates of World Peace in the city, also spoke. and having been a member of the recent national commission which met in New York, was able to
tell of the extent of the work that is being done officially in this country towards the bringing about of a better understanding between the nations. He has also travelled over most of the world and could speak with experience regarding the great need for a universal tongue. Mr. James McKirdy, chairman of the Pennsylvania Esperanto Association Executive Committee, spoke regarding the work accomplished by the propaganda of the Esperanto movement throughout the world, particularly showing its relationship to Universal Peace.
University of Chicago.-The Esperanto Club was reorganized, February 8. A lecture was given on that date by Prof. Papot, about forty members being present. The constitution adopted requires membership in the Esperanto Association of North America. The officers are: Carleton W. Washburne, president; Chester H. Greene, vicepresident; Dudley H. Grant, secretary and treasurer. The American Esperanto Book is used in instruction.
Terre Haute.-The last meeting of the Terre Haute Esperanto Club was one of the most enjoyable of the season. The reception room was decorated with the Esperanto colors, Esperanto banners were in evidence and best of all the spirit of unueco. A number of visitors were present and witnessed a most interesting program in Es-peranto-songs, poetry and prose recitations, free translation from foreign journals, games and contests followed a short Esperanto lesson. Sro. Clark was voted the thanks of the Club for his excellent and entertaining stories.
SAVANNAH.-The Esperantists of Savannah raised a fund of $\$ 185.35$ for the victims of the earthquake in Italy.
Los angeles.-The Esperanto Society of Los Angeles has recently elected the following officers: President, Thomas P. Smith; Vice-President, Miss Grayce Bernard; Secretary, Miss Virginia Troutman; Treasurer, Miss Mabel Gochenouer; Corresponding Secretary, Walter E. Smith; Board of Directors, Thomas P. Smith, Virginia Troutman, Mrs. Belle Gochenouer, Ralph Bond and A. Gaylord Beaman. The society proper, composed of advanced Esperantists, meets in Room 102 of the Blanchard Studios Building, 232 South Hill Street, every Saturday evening and conducts a class for beginners at the same place every Wednesday evening. The society has been in its present quarters over two years. The advanced class is at present reading "Ja Avarulo." All Esperantists visiting the city are urged to pay the society a visit. Special attention is given to learning to spenk Esperanto.
New England.-The New England Division of the Esperanto Association of North America held a meeting in Boston on February 27, and arranged for another meeting in March for the purpose of permanent organization. This Division is seriously taking up the matter of urging Esperanto as a study in the Federal schools. Some

of the members turn prophetic eyes to Boston as the possible seat of the Sixth Congress.

Indiana.-A recent number of the Evansville Courier says: "Dr. Ravdin, the well known oculist, has just returned from an extended trip in Europe. In relating his experience, he says that at one of the clinics in Paris, he met a noted surgeon who tried to talk to him in French but as he could not speak this tongue the Frenchman tried Esperanto and seemed disgusted with the American doctor when he confessed his ignorance of the universal language. Dr. Ravdin had several other experiences which convinced him that Esperanto is absolutely essential to the comfort and convenience of travelers abroad and he is now busy mastering the wonderful tongue."

Austin, Minnesota.-An Esperanto club of twenty-four members has been organized in Austin by Dr. F. E. Daigneau, who will be the instructor as well as president of the club. Mr. Fred Ulmer, editor of the local newspaper, is secretary of the club. and Miss Stella Slavin, vice-president. The club elected as honorary vicepresidents Mr. Franklin, superintendent of the city schools. Miss Sherwood, country superintendent, and Mrs. Skinner, ex-superintendent of county schools. Dr. Zamenhof was elected honorary president. The club is called L'Esperanta Stelo, and holds weekly meetings. Member are required to join the Esperanto Association of North America. The phonograph is used as an aid to instruction.

Moira, New York.-An Esperanto club, to be known as La Amika Rondo, was organized here in January. The president is Rev. William Thomas, the secretary, Miss Gertrude Hyde.

St. Edward, Nebraska.-A group with nine members has recently been organized at this place, by Rev. Chas. P. Lang.

Cincinnati.-A new course for beginners, taught by the secretary, Mr. David Peacock, was begun on March 5. The previous course was well attended and very successful.

## GOOD PROPAGANDA.

One of the very best methods of Esperanto propaganda is sent forth in a recent issue of the Pittsburgh Sun. J. M. Clifford, Jr. councillor for the Eastern Division, furnishes the Sun an interesting letter written in Esperanto by an eye-witness of the great Messina tragedy. This, accompanied by parallel text in English, is a practical argument of the international value of Esperanto. There are many events of world-wide interestfew, let us be thankful, so tragic as the Messina earthquake. If Esperantists can arrange to have these "covered" by a special correspondent on the spot, much appreciation will be shown by the newspapers if the accounts are well-written.

## BOOK REVIEWS

La Psalmaro.-The book of Psalms, translated from the original Hebrew by Dr. Zamenhof. This is the latest addition to biblical treasures in Esperanto, and is well worth the study of any Esperantist. It presents a vivid contrast to the Book of Ecclesiastes, already published in Esperanto under the title La Predikanto. The Psalmaro is probably the most distinctly Jewish book of the entire Bible, while the philosophy of La Predikanto, shorn of its familiar verbiage, might easily be ascribed to a Greek or Roman writer. Dr. Zamenhof, in La Psalmaro, shows how much superior is simplicity of language to exaggerated precision. Where, for example, those who stickle for "precision" would say glorifu la nomon de Dio, he uses simpler gloru; where the simpleton would write sanktoleizita, Dr. Zamenhof uses sanktoleita. Truly, by too many suffixes we insult the intelligence and overwork the eyes of the reader.

Cu Lif-Here is a book in which a question mark forms an appropriate part of the title. It contains 447 pages of good Esperanto, by the late Dr. Vallienne. Where the standard American novel quits, with the polite supposition that "they lived happily ever afterward" this one begins, and it deals with subsequent occurrences in a frankness of detail which would exclude it from the mails of this country if printed in English. It is recommended for the reason that it is original, and good Esperanto. The plot is not hard to forget, and the frank realism, while a bit unnecessary, is at least a refreshing contrast with the American novel, whose unrealism is suggestive of breakfast-food advertising. Cu Lif postpaid, $\$ 1.20$.

Kastelo de Prelongo.-Another original novel, by Dr. Vallienne, the eminent French Esperantist. Everything which is said of Cu Lif applies to this book, except that it contains 515 pages. Postpaid, \$1.20.

How to Know the Starry Heavens.-That astronomy is not a more popular subject of general study is the fault either of the human race or of astronomers. Certainly we cannot blame the stars, for they are just as interesting as they can be. A book of some 300 pages, published by the Frederick A. Stokes Company, and printed by the University Press of Cambridge, with plenty of pictures, is an attractive attempt to bring astronomy within the reach of the every-day sort of person. The title is "How to Know the Starry Heavens," and the author is Prof. Edward Irving, of Berkeley, California. The book is mentioned here because it is a good book on a fine subject; Amerika Esperantisto favors a law compelling all ministers, school teachers and politicians to read it. We regret that its three hundred somewhat formidable pages make it rather a large proposition for reproduction in Esperanto, for the author is an Esperantist and one of the best of them out West. If you are big enough not to be afraid of the dark, if you are big enough not to be scared by the proofs of the infinitesimal smallness of yourself and your world, send Mr. Irving two dollars for this book. It's worth a million.

Aspazio.-Our Polish samideanoj have again made known to us by means of Esperanto a Polish author whose works, though practically unknown to Americans, must be admitted to possess a literary value superior to a legion of "six best sellers." Aspazio, by Alexander Sventohovski, is a drama in five acts presenting a picture of Athens in the days when she was mistress of Greece. The characters are all known to us; in Pericles, Aspasia, Phidias, Socrates, Thucydides, Sophocles, Euripides and others we recognize the heroic figures of the period when Athens was the center of an art, literature and science such as no other city has ever possessed. We enter into their homes, and their ambitions, their hopes and fears, their triumphs and defeats are displayed before us. The story hinges about the plots of the Athenian aristocrats against Pericles, culminating in accusations of heresy against Aspasia. The curtain falls upon her triumphant acquittal by the council of the Areopagus, after an eloquent plea by Pericles. The translation is by Dr. Leon Zamenhof, and its style is fluent, easy and graceful. A "Postparolo" by Leo Belmont gives a sketch of the author and his contributions to Polish literature. Sventohovski, as editor of a Warsaw newspaper, was one of the first to give favorable publicity to Esperanto in the period when the language was young and struggling for recognition.

Muzika Terminaro.-This musical terminology for Esperanto is the work of F. de Menil, composer of the music of La Espero and many other Esperanto songs. It is the product of careful investigation and comparison of musical terms in the chief modern languages. The author states that owing to the fact that the different languages use their own terms to denote the various movements of music, it is almost impossible for one to read foreign music. "Because music is an international art we may hope that in the future one will use only Esperanto to show the musical movements. An appendix "Pri la Esperanta Muziko" is of especial value. Postpaid, 20 cents.

Edzigo Malarangita.-A clever little dialogue by the well known Spanish Esperantist V. Inglada. Sinjoro Timoplena, who comes to woo, after a protracted interview with the stern parent, leaves in disorder. The speeches are full of plays upon words and in future we shall have to relinquish what has hitherto been one of the strongest arguments for Esperanto, that it is impossible to pun in the language! This dialogue is well suited to make part of a program in Esperanto. Per copy, 20 cents.

La Jeso de Knabinoj.-A prose comedy in three acts by a famous Spanish dramatist, Leandro F. Moratin, translated by Norman Maclean, president of the group of Murcia, Spain. A classic of the Spanish drama, and a very pretty little play, well translated. Per copy, 20 cents.
