In the American capital, there will be an extraordinary observance at Powell Junior High School on the evening of December fourteenth.

## TWENTY SIXTH INTERNATIONAL CONGRESS OF ESPERANTO CONVENES IN STOCKHOLM AUGUST 4 - 11, 1934.

Geneva, Switzerland: The business meetings and sectional conferences of the 26th International Congress of Esperanto at Stockholm next August will be held in the Swedish National Parliament Building.

This honor conferred by the government of Sweden is paralleled by the action of the city of Stockholm in granting the use of the City Hall for the ball that climaxes the social festivities connected with the affair.

As neither of these buildings can accomodate the huge attendance expected at the solemn public meetings, these will be held in the giant auditorium of the Music Hall.

The North American Congress will be held in July, so one may plan to attend both.

Washington, D.C.: "Friends everywhere thru Esperanto" and eight other pro-Esperanto signs, were carried on decorated automobiles in the third annual Hallowe'en Parade, sponsored by the Greater National Capital Committee of the Board of Trade. Between 70,000 and 100,000 spectators lined "historic Pennsylvania Avenue" for the spectacle. Gaily costumed Esperanto youngsters of Miss Aminda J. Kruka's classes were awarded the Evening Times' silver loving cup.

For the Royal Court, 18 of the District's most beautiful girls were selected. Three were samideaninoj: Miss Kathryn Hite, Miss Lucille Turnage, and Miss Stewart Lewis, who was chosen Princess of the entire celebration.
