

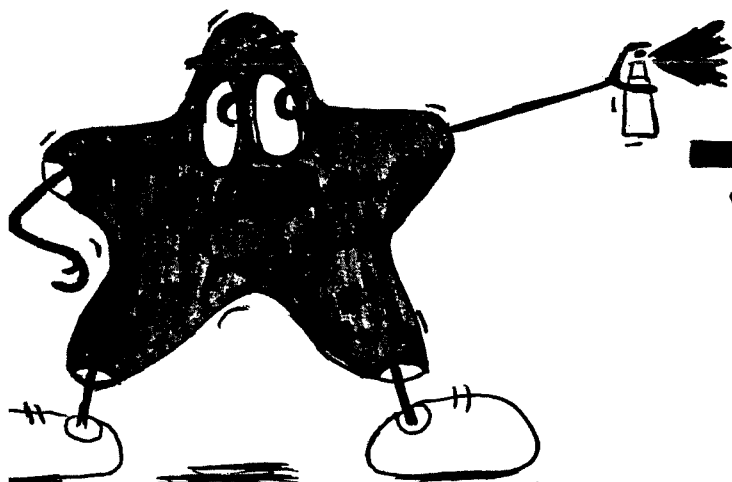

MIT Societo por Esperanto

In January, the Societo por Esperanto taught a two-week, basic Esperanto course at MIT (Massachusetts Institute of Technology). The course took place during the "Period of Independent Studies", a month-long period which allowed the students to participate in a variety of special seminars, lectures, etc.

Among the courses this

year included an "Intensive Esperanto" course. This course attracted 13 participants, of which 8 finished the entire course (the others were unable to finish for lack of time).

The course lasted two weeks, with an hour of instruction daily. The instructor, Jens Karlsson, and the author of the course workbook, Daniel Albro, are both activists in the Societo.

The workbook, "An Elementary Esperanto Primer", was written last year and was available free to students. The students learned both basic grammar and the words most often used in Esperanto, through examples such as "Mia kusenveturilo estas plena de angiloj". In addition, the students learned about the Esperanto movement and culture, ex. by listening to a song by the Esperanto rock group *Persone*. At the end of the course, each participant received a pin.
